



Ol Plastic Pollution


April Month Campaign Theme;

"Beat the Plastic Habit"



Cause of Plastic Pollution

- It will take ~ 500 years to break down into smaller and smaller pieces, depending on the type of plastic and environmental factors Even then, these microplastics never truly disappear and can cause problems for wildlife and potentially even human health.
- It is significant concern, impacting our soil, water, and ultimately, our health.
- Every year, a massive amount of plastic ends up in our environment, harming wildlife, disrupting ecosystems, and even entering the food chain.





Cont...

- In Ethiopia Evidences showed that several types of plastic waste were generated:
 - Plastic bags/festal (46%),
 - Water and soft drink bottles (34%),
 - household utensils (16%) and
 - others (4%) including plastic shoes, cooking oil and detergent containers.







Solutions....

- Reduce our reliance on single-use plastics. (below 0.003mm banned according to our proclamation)
- Choose reusable alternatives whenever possible.
- Support businesses and policies that promote plastic reduction and recycling.
- Participate in beach cleanups and other community initiatives to remove plastic pollution from the environment.








Cont ...



- Requires a multi-pronged approach.
- Reducing our reliance on single-use plastics.
- Opting for reusable water bottles, shopping bags, and food containers are simple yet impactful choices.
- Supporting prioritize plastic reduction reuse and recycling
- Participating in community cleanups and raising awareness.





02 Air Pollution

May Month Campaign Theme;

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Air pollution

- Air pollution is a major health concern, causing respiratory problems, heart disease, and even cancer.
- Globally, approximately 6.7 million deaths annually attributed to exposure air pollution.
- Equivalent to 8.3% of the 2019 GDP and 38,972 deaths per year in 2019 were attributable to House Air Pollution.





Major sources of air pollution

- · Vehicle emissions,
- Industrial facilities, and
- Agricultural practices.
- Open burning of garbage waste,
- · Biomass use for energy, etc







Solutions

- Invest in cleaner energy sources such as solar, wind, and geothermal power.
- Promote sustainable transportation options like public transport, cycling, and walking.
- Implement stricter regulations on industrial emissions.
- Use Energy efficient cooking technologies.
- Advocate for policies that support cleaner air and sustainable development.











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
June Month Campaign Theme;

Water pollution

- Water pollution contaminates our freshwater and saltwater resources, posing a threat to human health, ecosystems, and economic activities.
- Reports revealed that in Ethiopia, 60% to 80% of communicable diseases are associated with unsafe water, cause 25,000
 5 years annually due to water pollution.





Sources


- Industrial waste,

- Liquid discharges from hotels and tour areas






Solutions

04 Soil Pollution


July Month Campaign Theme;

Soil Pollution

- Soil pollution involves the contamination of soil with harmful substances, including chemicals, heavy metals, and plastic debris.
- Soil pollution can impact agricultural productivity, disrupt soil ecosystems, and pose a threat to human health through contaminated food and water.
- Sources of soil pollution include agricultural practices, industrial waste disposal, and improper waste management.





Solutions

- Promote crop rotation, cover cropping, and composting to improve soil health and reduce reliance on harmful chemicals.
- Implement proper waste management practices to prevent the contamination of soil with plastic debris and other waste.
- Advocate for regulations on the use of harmful chemicals in agriculture and industry to minimize soil pollution.

Sound Pollution

- It is defined as sound that is undesirable or detracts from one's quality of life or an excessive amount of sound in the surrounding area.
- In Ethiopia, sound pollution is frequently an overlooked problem among other environmental pollutions.





Effect of Sound Pollution

- Decrease the efficiency and quality of work of human beings.
- Reduces concentration level as high level of sound causes fatigue and tiredness.
- Hugely affects the pregnant women and cause irritation and abortion.
- Cause temporary or permanent deafness because sound level.
- Cause communication problems and lead to misunderstanding.





Solution

- Social awareness creation on causes, effects, and solutions of sound pollution.
- Use equipment's such as ear plugs and earmuffs for hearing protection.

- Factories and industries should be located far from the residential areas.
- Planting bushes and trees for effective solution for sound pollution.







06 ESIA


September Month Campaign Theme;
